For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

- * Note TSI and ATS definitions were changed for the 2019-20 school year per federal requirements. The new definitions are:
- TSI- The school has at least one subgroup performing in the bottom 25% within each applicable accountability index component.
- ATS- The school has met the criteria for TSI identification and has at least one subgroup performing at the same level as a CSI school.

Our school was identified as a "Has not been given one of these labels."

- 1. All students in grades K-2 are assigned to Coopersville East Elementary/West Early Childhood Center, unless their special education status requires them to attend a self-contained program that is located in another building, or another district.
- 2. Coopersville East Elementary and West Early Childhood Center's School Improvement Plan is revised yearly to meet the needs of our students. We will continue to implement all aspects of the plan when we begin the 2022-23 school year. Copies of the plan are posted on the district's website and can also be obtained at the main office.
- 3. There are no specialized schools for Coopersville East Elementary/West Early Childhood Center.
- 4. Coopersville East Elementary and West Early Childhood Center aligns its core curriculum to the Common Core State Standards according to the Michigan Department of Education. An explanation and/or copy of the curriculum may be obtained from teachers or the principal.
- 5. Results of other testing measures, such as the reading DIBELS data, is shared with parents and quardians at parent-teacher conferences, or other informal meetings.
- 6. Coopersville East Elementary and West Early Childhood Center has had outstanding support from parents and guardians. The last four years have had over 96% attendance at parent/teacher conferences for both fall and spring sessions.

East Elementary and West Early Childhood Center are dedicated to continuous improvement. With continued efforts from our staff, students, parents, and community, we can assure you that we will strive to meet our goals and achieve our mission. Thank you for your support!
